





Here I was on the course "Advanced tools in traumatology and orthopedic for general doctors."





These early experiences set the stage for her academic success, leading her to pursue a master's degree in international business administration at Xochicalco University in Tijuana.

College Experience:

Commencing college wasn't without its challenges, requiring Alexa to travel at dawn for classes. However, her determination and adaptability prevailed, even more so when the pandemic necessitated a shift to online learning. Despite the unconventional graduation experience, Alexa expressed gratitude for achieving this significant milestone with the support of her parents and boyfriend.


