






Hello Ruth and Rosemary, I am very happy to tell you about what happened in Guanajuato! I have a lot to tell you so I will send you three different emails o that you can better understand the trip and the competition. first I have to admit that the city is very beautiful and very colonial, I felt like I was in Europe hahaha, there are too many cathedrals and basilicas that inside are lined with gold! and others outside had posters with faces and names of disappeared women and others with phrases referring to all the femicides that have occurred in Mexico. We visited several museums such as the mummies museum and others that explained how people were tortured during the inquisition. We also visited the tomb of José Alfredo Jiménez, a famous singer from Mexico, and the mines where they extracted silver and different precious stones such as quartz. We met a man who worked as a miner and everything he lived there, without a doubt, was one of the most dangerous and less paid, they exploited the worker a lot and most of them did not reach old age, they died very young, it was very interesting to go through a mine several meters deep. We were fortunate to stay in the center of the city, so everything was relatively close to us and we could walk to various parts of the city, including restaurants, the alley of the kiss, cathedrals and everything that a magical town offers you. We also traveled to San Miguel de Allende, a beautiful city with a huge basilica. We toured several towns both day and night.

In the same way, we had to witness a march, for a student who killed a national guard and also a parade they did for Children's Day, that celebration is very big. We also went out to meet bars and most of them had very interesting but cultural themes, like one that we liked a lot that had an Aztec theme. They also told us a story that is very famous in the city, of a man who sacrificed his life so that his people, who were defending the city from the Spaniards, would enter a cathedral where they were protecting themselves and thus be able to recover the city again, They made a statue of that character called La Pípila. Undoubtedly this trip was full of stories and cultures, and all this is reflected in the architecture, when I studied this career I was able to better appreciate what I was seeing.

The first day they took us to meet our team, which was 10 members in total from each state of the country, there were people from Sinaloa, Cancún, Querétaro, Michoacán, etc. and they also told us what the competition was going to be about, we had to make affordable housing. This was going to last four days, and every day we had to present progress on the project. Despite the fact that the team was large, we had a lot of work to deliver, so from the beginning we stated our abilities so that what we were doing would be made easier for each of us. and so we had those 4 days but on the third day I got intoxicated with a hot dog! I didn't like him very much and that delayed me in my work. Arriving at the hotel at night I felt so bad that I threw up the little I had eaten, which was nothing more than the hot dog, because the competition was from 8 in the morning until 8 at night and I had not had breakfast, only I had eaten that hot dog, and I couldn't eat dinner anymore. For this we still had a lot of work to do because the 4th day was the final delivery and all the competitors were still working in the hotel because there were still many things to do. So I locked myself in my room and went to work but I felt terrible, on the 4th day I couldn't attend the event for the same reason, but I stayed supporting my team from the hotel and kept working on the project until the end. Important architects from all over the world reviewed the project, most of them were Spanish, Colombian and Argentine. They gave us constructive criticism, several successes and some errors. In the end we were happy with the result and we were glad to meet each other, each one had different ways of carrying out a project, they had different cultures and unique accents that in the end enriched coexistence and you learned from each one of them.

Without a doubt, it was something that I would do again and that without a doubt I learned something from each one. Many thanks to the scholarship foundation for the support they gave me to be able to attend this architecture competition. and to you for always supporting me not only financially but also morally. 


